Speaking of PR, we have two PR related events coming up this month.

Camp Bandage is Saturday 21 MAY 16. The TRO will be one of about 80 exhibitors at this safety / first aid / emergency response & preparation education event. The location is the same as last year, Chisholm Trail South Park, 4000 E New Orleans, Broken Arrow OK. (East of 101st & the Creek Turnpike, on the other side from the NSU-BA campus. The turnpike does cross 101st at two places, this is the eastern crossing in southeast Broken Arrow) The event is open to the public from 10 AM to 3 PM. We can go out to start setting up Friday night, or as early as 6 AM.

The second PR related event this month is the program at our regular membership meeting, Tuesday 24 MAY 16, 7 PM, where I will speak about PR And The Average Ham. Come early (6 PM) if you want to eat!

Of course, ARRL Field Day is a big PR opportunity. This annual multiplex and international event combines emergency preparedness, public relations, and a contest in one event. The Tulsa Repeater Organization will hold their Field Day operation in the air-conditioned Okmulgee EOC, 110 N Alabama Ave, Okmulgee, OK.

MINUTES: April 2016 TRO Membership Meeting
03 MAY 16 (postponed due to severe weather on originally scheduled date)
Tally's Good Food Cafe, 11th & Yale

President Mark Conklin, N7XYO, opened the meeting at 1900 by asking if any visitors were present. Three people responded: Tony White, KA5TRO, Tom Boley, KG5LFX, and Ron Wortham, a friend of Paul Teel, WB5ANX. Introductions followed, with a total attendance of 24.

Minutes of the previous meetings were published and available online in the club newsletter, The Signal. Ben Joplin, WB5VST moved we accept the minutes as published, Kenneth Baucum, KG5CBM, seconded, and motion passed.

Minutes of the Executive Committee meetings were also published in The Signal. Paul Young, KE5EHM moved we accept the minutes as published, Kenneth seconded, and motion passed.

Treasurer Steve Miller, AA5V, read the Treasurer's report. Stan Callahan, KA5STN, moved to accept, Sue Gorkos, KG5GOE, seconded, and motion passed.

Tom Stroud, KD5OPH, in the Membership report, stated that if anyone had questions or concerns about membership, they could contact him. He also reported on the progress of Chris Lieberman, long-time supporter of TRO.

No reports from By-Laws or Operating Standards.

Doug Lee, KC5ZQM, Public Relations chair, reported that the club is now on Twitter as TulsaRepeaters, and encouraged all members on Twitter to follow us. He also discussed plans for Camp Bandage on 21 MAY at the Chisholm Trail Park South in Broken Arrow.

Engineering Chair Joe Gorkos, N5TEX, reported that 3 repeaters are now in place and active at Skyline, no changes to the PL tones on .88, and the .88 rebuild is on hold until storm season is over.

Kenneth, KG5CBM reported on pending public service events: Maple Ridge, Tour de Cure, FreeWheel, and Bike MS.

Maple Ridge: no application received yet, discussion followed abt the need for an application for this event. Ben WB5VST, moved that we work this without requiring an application, Ray Young, K5CFY seconded, and motion passed. Kenneth added that a map of the new route is available on the FleetFeet Tulsa website and he would post a link to it.

Tour de Cure is 04 JUN. Routes will still begin and end at Hillcrest South, but some changes will be made, including *(continued on next page)*

the addition of a 100-mile ride. Stan KA5STN moved we work this event, Ben seconded, and the motion passed.

OKFreeWheel is 19 – 25 JUN. Volunteers will be allowed to work only one day if needed. Joe N5TEX moved we work the event, Ben WB5VST seconded, and motion passed.

Bike MS: route much the same as last year, from Norman to Guthrie on Saturday, then Guthrie to Stillwater on Sunday. Because this is outside our service area, and we had to have assistance from Oklahoma City area clubs last year, discussion arose concerning handing the event off to those clubs. Tom Shaw, K5OVT, moved to investigate that possibility, Bart Pickens, N5TWB, seconded, and motion passed.

In old/unfinished business, Mark N7XYO presented the results of the straw poll from both the online and mail-in ballots, and the numbers come out to approximately 76 percent opposed to the dissolution of the club.

In new business, Mark discussed the message we recently received by someone who needs help preparing for a ham radio estate sale, and mentioned this would be a good item to hand off to the Ham Rescue group based in Rogers County. Tom, KD5OPH, moved we do that, Steve AA5V seconded, and the motion passed.

Mark N7XYO then asked Paul, WB5ANX, Tulsa County ARES Emergency Coordinator, to discuss the Net Control Training class that will start later in May.

Tony KA5TRO then talked about efforts of Paul Bisdorf, AE5PB, with the Broken Arrow EOC, to bring ARRL Emcomm and FEMA AUXCOMM classes to the Tulsa area, and he passed out sign up sheets for those interested in such classes.

Mark N7XYO then brought up Field Day. Discussion followed on whether we want to join with TARC again, or go our own way, if we wanted to one day or stay overnight, and the possible locations. Tom, K5OVT mentioned the W5OK callsign was available to whoever asks for it first. Joe N5TEX moved we do both days of Field Day at the Okmulgee EOC, Kenneth KG5CBM seconded, and the motion passed.

Bart asked about the use of TRO repeaters by TARC for their public service events coming up. Mark said they could, just check with Joe about technical issues beforehand.

Tony KA5TRO then told about the Museum Ships On The Air event, stating that it is a fun event and a good warm-up for Field Day.

Stan KA5STN and Ray K5CFY reported on the disaster training drill the next day at Tulsa International Airport.

Mark N7XYO opened the meeting at 1911.

Minutes of the April Executive Committee meeting were published in The Signal. Paul KE5EHM moved to accept the minutes as published. Ben WB5VST, seconded, and motion passed on vote.

Doug KC5ZQM had sent minutes of the April membership meeting to the Committee, but Steve AA5V had noted some editing changes that needed to be made. Paul KE5EHM moved to accept the minutes as presented after Doug edited them, Steve seconded, and motion passed.

Steve AA5V then handed out copies of the Treasury report. Ben WB5VST moved to accept, Paul KE5EHM seconded, and motion passed.

Mark N7XYO informed Paul that he will have to conduct the May membership meeting because he will be out of town. Doug KC5ZQM said he had thought about doing a presentation about Public Relations And The Average Ham. His discussion would cover whys, wherefores and how-tos. Doug also added that he is planning on reducing the membership brochure from a fourfold to a threefold.

Field Day plans covered promotion, equipment, food, and prizes.

Doug KC5ZQM will coordinate with Activities Chair Kenneth Baucum, KG5CBM, to promote the event through Survey Monkey, Facebook, email, etc.

Engineering Chair Joe Gorkos, N5TEX, had indicated by email that he will bring out an FT-847 HF radio. Ben WB5VST will hand off the ARRL Ham-Aid HF station at Camp Bandage on the 21st because he will be out of town. Sub Club tower trailer will not be available as it is already committed to the Mayes County club in Pryor.

We will go with burgers and dogs instead of BBQ, and the Boy Scouts will cook. The club will supply water, coffee and tea. Members will be asked to bring sides and chips, but to let us know what they are bringing so we don't wind up with too much potato salad and not enough baked beans.

Mark N7XYO then brought up the possibility of giving away prizes after supper on Saturday, with a total of \$100 spent on them. Ed K5CRQ moved that we do the giveaways, Steve AA5V seconded, and the motion passed.

Ben WB5VST asked if the DVR on the .88 repeater was down. Steve AA5V will check it out for sure. Ben added the CW ID on .88 was too loud during Tour de Tulsa.

Doug KC5ZQM suggested that Steve AA5V add Facebook and Twitter feeds to the front page of the website, similar to the ones on the Storm Prediction Center's website, to make the posting of new information faster. Steve said he would look into it. He is rebuilding the website for just that reason, but for now, he needs the information fed to him directly. When he receives it, he does put it on the website as soon as possible.

Ben WB5VST requested the club buy a new antenna for the APRS radio in the Command Post box. Mark N7XYO responded that the APRS budget should cover it, and he only needs to inform the Board what he wants to buy (type, model, price, source, etc.)

Paul moved to close at 2021, Steve seconded, motion passed.

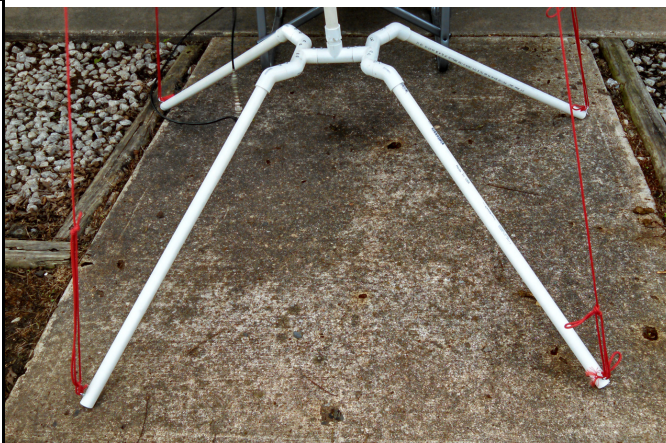

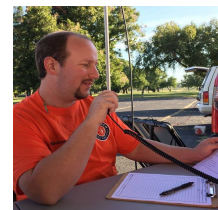


The base of Doug Lee's portable antenna mast, with guy lines; part of his portable station.

The Tulsa ARES organization is offering training to become a net control operator (NCO). NCO's are critically important to our ability to conduct proper nets during emergencies. We are looking for ARES members that want to learn how to run a net. The training will include an overview of NCO' duties and best practices along with a place in a rotation that will allow practice. SEVERE WEATHER REPORTING CRITERIA

This is part commentary, part information.

Tulsa has already had a couple of significant severe weather events. One event, on 30 MAR, saw a tornado move across North Tulsa and into Southern Claremore. The second event, on 26 APR, saw what I call a mini-outbreak of EF-1 tornados across Northeast Oklahoma. The Net Controls, Ray Young, K5CFY, and Kenneth Baucum, KG5CBM, both did an outstanding job handling heavy radio traffic in the midst of the chaos.

I did not have anything to report, so I stayed off the air, but I did listen. Of course, at times when Net Control was only interested in tornado reports, some called in rain and hail reports. This is wasteful of the Net Control's time, and could lead to an important report not made because someone is reporting on something that the NWS can tell from radar. I believe a solution to this problem is to change how the NWS and Skywarn Net Controls present the reporting criteria in the spotter training, and in the net script. So, the criteria I present here is not the "official" list, but one based on priority – Doug Lee, KC5ZQM

SECONDARY IMPORTANCE

HAIL 1 INCH OR LARGER

(1 inch hail is the size of a quarter; compare to coins, golf balls, etc.)

WINDS 58 MPH OR GREATER

DAMAGE AND MAJOR FLOODING
