AMATEUR RADIO HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION (HOA) LEGISLATION – ARRL OKLAHOMA:

As you are likely aware, there are two bills before Congress which will protect amateur radio Antennas from overly restrictive HOA rules and covenants, HR 4066 and SB 3690. John Stratton, N5AUS, West Gulf Division Director has initiated a letter writing campaign for the West Gulf Division. For those of us in Oklahoma, we need to contact our respective Senators and House members to encourage their support of these measures. The bills have a goodly amount of bipartisan support for this issue and we must strike while the soldering iron is hot!

We need Congress to approve these bills, and we need your help as an individual amateur radio operators to help encourage our Oklahoma legislators to take action to pass them.

Because ARES is an amateur radio program, only licensed radio amateurs are eligible for membership. The possession of emergency-powered equipment is desirable, but is not a requirement for membership.
