BIOGRAPHIES OF **TRO** OFFICER NOMINEE'S FOR 2013/2014

President: Stan Callahan—KE5HPB

I have been asked to run for TRO President for a fourth term. I have been in TRO for about 7+ years. I received my ticket in 2006 but have been around radios for a very long time. I was a licensed C.B radio operator in the 70's and early 80's as KZX- 4603. I was in and President of Creek Co Emergency Mgt.untill 1 year after B. J. Pope passed. After that I was on the Salvation Army Emergency Response Team of Sapulpa and Northeast Oklahoma. I trained new members on operations of the response team as well as the first storm spotting team for them. I now currently work as a NCO for the National Weather Service and storm spot for them on occasion and help in the training of new NCO's.

I have as your President for the last 3 years been asked to serve again, making this a 4th consecutive term by the approval of the members at large at the January membership meeting. I do look forward to serving you again as your President, but I don't do this alone. I work with the rest of the Executive board as well as the membership at large.

Vice-President: Ben Joplin—WB5VST

I have served as President, Treasurer, Membership Committee Chairman and Activities Committee Chairman since becoming a TRO member in 1976. I started with a Technician license in 1976 and upgraded to Extra in 1979. In the past I have been a VE test examiner and have been an active member in the Skywarn Group.

Secretary: Ed Compos—K5CRQ

I'm Ed Compos K5CRQ and I have been the Club Secretary for 8 or 9 years and will continue to do the job if you all wish. I hold a tech class license and enjoy working the different runs and events that the TRO Club works with. Thanks in advance for your support.

Treasurer: Steve Miller—AA5V

I have been Treasurer of the *TRO* for seven years in the past and it is my fourth office held in *TRO* since becoming a member in 1978. I have been the Site Chairman of the 146.94 MHz repeater since 1981. My interest in amateur radio began with earning the Amateur Extra Class license and Commercial Radiotelephone license in 1978. I have been a member of ARRL since April 1977.

Additional membership activities include my participation in the planning committee for Green Country Hamfest, Inc., VE test examiner, webmaster for *TRO* and Green Country and as an active member in the Skywarn Group. My occupation is a Lead Programmer Analyst for Tulsa County.

Trustee: Merlin Griffin—WB5OSM

My Call is WB5OSM first licensed as WN5EMG in 1971 back when Novices were only allowed CW operation on 80, 40, and 15 meters. Crystal controlled and power limit of 75 Watts DC Input. I mainly operated on 40 meter CW, and the Xtals I chose, I learned there were shortwave broadcasters at night on two of the three frequencies. It was my 75 watts against their 1/4 megawatt.

I now hold the Extra Class license and as many of you know I am a highly experienced ARRL accredited Volunteer Examiner. One of the most experienced in the U. S. I have participated in somewhere around 250 test sessions.

I am a past president of the TRO. I also serve as president of Green Country Hamfest, Inc. I am vicepresident and frequency coordinator for Oklahoma Repeater Society, Inc. We coordinate repeater frequencies in the state of Oklahoma and work with coordinators in the surrounding states to minimize interference across state lines. I serve as net control operator for the Tulsa Skywarn operation. Which I have been involved in that for many years. I think some of the other Skywarn NCO refer to me as NCO Emeritus. I also serve TRO as the engineering site chairman for the 146.88 repeater.

I have been employed by the City of Tulsa for 35 years, currently doing database administration and computer support for the Public Works Departments Quality Assurance Laboratory. I have expertise in both fields, analytical chemistry and computer science.

I reside in Owasso and have been an Owassoan since before it was cool. I am married to Lynda KE5VYN and have two beautiful grandchildren living with us most of the time, Kevyn eight and Lexie who just turned seven. You have seen the bumper sticker, "If I knew grandchildren were so much fun I would have had them first." I pulled that off.

TRO ENGINEERING REPORT JOE GORKOS N5TEX

Here is a quick update on our TRO repeater systems for this past year:

City-Plex site; we moved the 146.88 receive antenna further away from the TX antenna, also changed out the coax on the receiver side. We also changed out several small coax jumpers in the repeater cabinet thus reducing inter-mod issues. Need to replace the back up battery which is on site. Need to change out coax run on the TX side, the coax is ready, just waiting for good weather. Also need to readjust the TX antenna for better VSWR.

900Mhz system has coax and antenna in place. Need to install the repeater. Waiting for the repeater.


Sunoco Building; Installed the 146.94 repeater on existing mast and coax. System audio needs slight adjustment, all is working good. Good coverage for downtown area, can be used for parades and other downtown activities.

Skiatook; Lot of work needs to happen including change out of antennas, and coax, waiting for good weather. This one is work in progress.

Skyline East; The 444.1 repeater is up and working on existing antenna and coax providing good coverage city wide. At some point additional work is required on the antenna and coax.

Autumn Oaks: New antenna and coax installed on the 146.805 system, major improvement in coverage.

All of these systems have been worked on by club members who volunteered their time and efforts to make these major changes and improvements to the TRO repeater system. A big thanks to all of them.....
