Report from Merlin Griffin – WB5OSM

On July 16, 2020 a VE Testing session was held at the Tulsa Red Cross, with the following results:

The next TRO sponsored VE testing session will be held on September 17 @ 19:00 American Red Cross Chapter, Tulsa 11th and HWY 169.

The Rogers County Wireless Association held a VE Testing session in Owasso on July 4. They served 14 applicants and I don't remember all the stats, but it was like 8-9 new Techs, a couple of upgrades to General and a couple of Extras. On May 23 TARC sponsored a test session in Sperry where the VE team of the minimum required three VE's served around 13-14 applicants, with about the same results as the Owasso session. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic exam sessions have been scarce nationwide. Oklahoma and the Tulsa area are no exception. We are slowly getting back in business. The Sperry test session and the Tulsa test session, the VE Teams were just the minimum three VE's and to some extent guys that hadn't worked together before. At Sperry we asked the applicants to stay at least six feet apart, had hand sanitizer available, and used one-time use test booklets. The Owasso session was a lot of people in a small space. We had hand sanitizer available and the VE's all wore face masks. At the Tulsa Red Cross session, you must wear a mask to enter the building, during business hours temperatures are checked. Hand sanitizer was also available. With the small number of applicants everyone was able to stay over six feet apart. So, we are handling the pent-up demand and taking precautions too.

MORE THAN 12,000 REGISTER EARLY FOR QSO TODAY VIRTUAL HAM EXPO:



More than 12,000 have registered to attend the first *QSO Today* Virtual Ham Expo, August 8 – 9, *QSO Today* host Eric Guth, 4Z1UG, said this week.

"Since the Expo is a completely new experience for the ham radio community, it's great that so many people are excited and already registered," he said. "And with almost 3 weeks before the event, the number of registrants continues to increase." Attendance is free and there are early-bird prize incentives for registering by July 24. More than a typical web meeting, the Expo is built on a live virtual platform commonly used by Fortune 500 companies and major universities. The platform simulates a convention experience with an exhibit hall and booths

staffed by live attendants, a speaker auditorium, and even a lobby. Attendance just requires an internet connection and a computer, tablet, or smartphone.

The Expo will offer four separate speaker tracks focusing on a range of topics. Speakers will also be able to provide related material, such as slides and white papers, that attendees can download. Every session will have a Q&A where attendees can submit questions in real time via chat.

More than 30 booths will be open for attendees to visit, and exhibitors will have different options to engage with attendees. Exhibitor booths can provide downloadable content, such as videos, spec sheets, and manuals, and attendees can save content in a virtual briefcase to read later. Visitors will also be able to interact one-on-one with booth representatives, using a Skype-like system.

"The experience of a virtual expo is not meant to replace in-person conventions," Guth said. "However, I strongly believe that virtual events in our community are here to stay. Given COVID-19 and its likely lasting impact on travel, especially given our demographic, this virtual expo enables the ham community to continue coming together to learn and engage." Guth said that younger hams who have grown up with the internet will feel comfortable with the Expo platform, "making it easier for them to participate and find their place in this remarkable hobby."

Access to all speaker presentations and exhibitor booth content will remain on the Expo site for 30 days following the event.

The *QSO Today* Virtual Ham Expo is an ARRL-sanctioned hamfest.
