This year, we held our Field Day operation at a new location: Kiefer Municipal Park. I have to admit that I am guilty for this choice.

Last year, we decided to go our own way after combining efforts with TARC at Chandler Park for several years, and we went to the Okmulgee Emergency Operations Center. While that location gave us air-conditioned comfort, turnout by TRO members was low and public interaction was nil. Despite bad band conditions and some equipment issues leading to low contact numbers, we had fun.

But this year, surveys of the members indicated that they wanted to stay closer to Tulsa. The two places suggested at first didn't work out because one was unavailable, and the other was somewhat isolated from the public.

That's when I got to thinking about my hometown park. I was somewhat familiar with it because when they had their annual July 3<sup>rd</sup> fireworks displays, I would go up by the gazebo and concessions building to get barbeque. I had often thought this would be a good setting for Field Day because of the trees that would provide shade and serve as wire antenna supports.

So, when I went to Kiefer Town Hall to pay my utility bill, I asked what was required to secure use of the park. For a deposit of \$50.00, we would get use of the entire park, and the deposit would be returned if we left the place clean and undamaged.

I made my suggestion to the other officers and they agreed to propose it to the membership at the May meeting. Two days after the meeting, I wrote a personal check to the town for the deposit.

Personally, I am glad the members approved of the park. I live within walking distance, and my car had died the Saturday before the meeting while returning from Camp Bandage.

I reserved use of the park from 0800 (8 AM) to 2000 (10 PM), on Saturday, 24 JUN. I handled most of the planning through Facebook and email.

Planning was pretty much over when I picked up the key to the kitchen and restrooms of the concessions building on the Thursday before FD. Paul Young, KE5EHM, helped me take the PR kit, banners with frames, and the dualbander and battery from my car to the park the next day.

That Saturday morning, I left the house at 0700 with my laptop computer and a magmount antenna. The first thing I did at the park was to use the island in the kitchen to mount the large banner on its frame. I leaned the banner against the pumpjack next to the park's entrance, and then went across the railroad tracks beside the park to the convenience store for some breakfast. As I was coming back across the tracks, Paul KE5EHM pulled in.

Paul brought the ARRL / ARES Ham-Aid station, batteries, solar panels, a generator, and poles for antenna supports.

Fred Williams, KD5NBR, and Michael Parker, KG5TOV arrived soon after. Fred brought his Yaesu FT-897, 44 ft. mast, G5RV, and similar power sources to what Paul brought. Michael came to help in general, and he proved to be helpful, staying the entire time and assisting others as needed.

I left them to figure out how and where to set up their equipment while I continued setting up the

PR materials. I also set up my dualband ICOM IC-208H for

Paul KE5EHM set up in the covered patio area on the east side of the concessions building, Steve AA5V set up in the gazebo, and Fred KD5NBR set up on a picnic table, underneath his own awning. Fred and Paul ran their stations off of a combination of batteries and solar; Steve used a generator feeding a power supply.

Fred seemed to be the only to make a significant number of contacts. He uses his HF equipment more often, so he could more easily set up and adjust his equipment.

I tried using the Ham-Aid station, and even though I could hear stations clearly, I couldn't get anyone to come back to me, except once or twice, and then the band conditions would change and I couldn't complete the contact. At one point, I noticed the LDG tuner that is part of the station wasn't installed. We found it was still in the case, connected it up, and the station still didn't make any contacts.

I have to admit that I might be responsible for that. That station has been set up at several PR events and Field Day operations over the years, and one of the first times I tried using the station, I tried adjusting the tuner without becoming familiar with it first. So, I probably messed up the settings. I have downloaded the manual, and I will study to see how to get the tuner back to normal.

Because we had a small turnout, we decided not to have a cookout. (Because the kitchen does have a couple of electric grills, it might have been a cook-in anyway...) So, I ordered pizza and wings from Papa John's using my online account on my laptop. Everyone was pleased with my selections.
